**1. MOTION TO ADOPT AGENDA**

President Sanders called for a motion to adopt the agenda. A motion was presented by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Dr. Denson. A vote was taken and the motion to adopt the agenda passed unanimously.

**2. WELLNESS COMMITTEE REPORT**

Dr. Garver gave the Wellness Committee report. There are currently 133 people in the screening program. This number includes individuals with signed monitoring contracts but does not include the number of individuals who chose not to contact the Board after being advised to by investigators or staff.

There are 3 technicians in residential treatment and one technician is being evaluated for relapse. There is one pharmacist in residential treatment for relapse. There is one pharmacist who is being held out for six months before being presented to the Board who is home now doing well. There is one student in treatment. There is one student who recently refused an evaluation and withdrew from school. And there is one student who is being evaluated for non-drug related competency problem.

The total number of pharmacy professionals identified and worked with in 2019 is six.

**3. PRESENTATIONS:**

- Nick Meza with Quarles & Brady on behalf of Medimpact, Ashley Stevenson, and Amy Delano with Medimpact returned and gave a presentation still requesting pharmacy services permit and permission to provide remote order entry with Humana and Novixus Pharmacy. A motion was made by Dr. Denson to allow Medimpact Direct to have a pharmacy services permit and to have ROE with Humana only. Mr. Phung seconded . A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.
- Tommy Cobb gave a presentation to propose changes on how we permit institutional pharmacies in Alabama. The Board listened to the proposed changes and tabled this for now until further research can be done.
- Wayne Gafnea with CM Pharmaceuticals is requesting a wholesale permit. Ms. Gafnea explained he had an MDW permit but never operated as a business. Mr. Sorrell made a motion to give executive secretary, Donna Yeatman, the authority to grant the permit for wholesale when the criteria listed by board are met. Dr. Denson seconded. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

**4. TREASURER'S REPORT:**

Treasurer Brenda Denson presented the treasurer's report. Total revenues are at 92.25 percent of the fiscal year budget. Total expenses are at 54.44 percent of the fiscal year budget, which is right on target for the year. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and
